GOOD MORNING

Today is a very special day for all of us gathered here at the University premises and online, it is yet another of our Graduation Day. This day marks the end of our students' long academic journey from kindergarten, to primary and secondary school and thereafter four years at the University of Embu. Today, we also celebrate the end of a very stressful Academic Year marred by the COVID-19 Pandemic.
